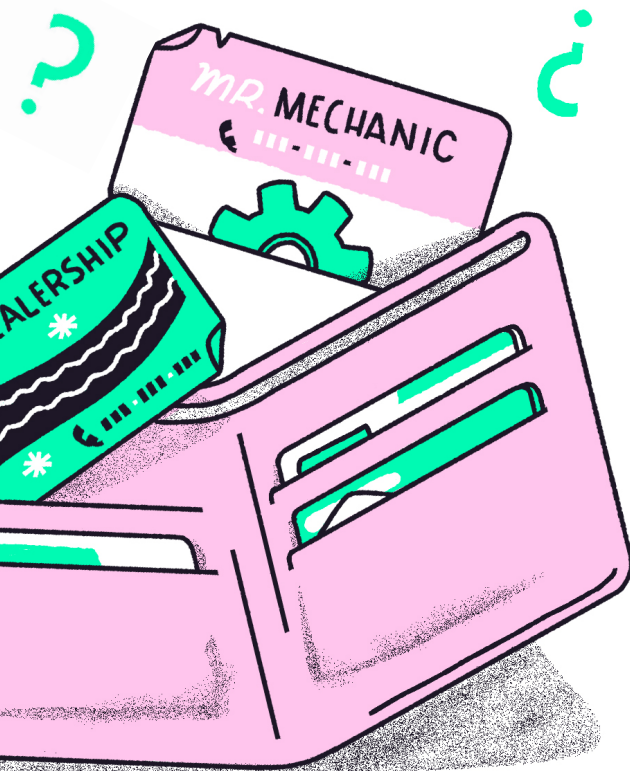


Realistic Financial Scenarios

Life is a tough tutor, and the “right” decision often isn’t obvious: do you repair your old car when it breaks down, or buy a new one?

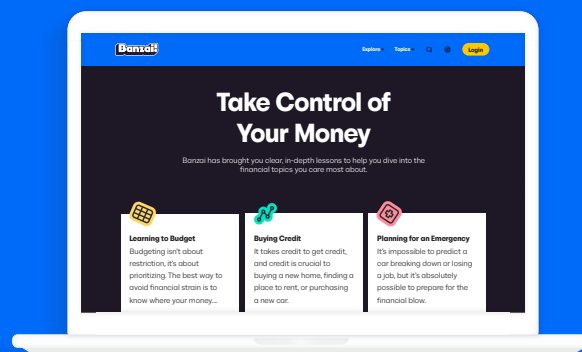
